The hourly rate used to formulate the indicative budget for all types of PHB is currently £13.10 per hour in line with agreed CCG hourly rate for domiciliary care.

A PHB is based on the budget required to meet assessed care needs for an individual who is eligible for CHC funding. That is, the patient is assessed as having a primary health need. This budget will encompass health and social care needs, as opposed to social activities which are not funded by the NHS.

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11. Whether you permit 'close family members' who do not live with the 'service user' to be employed under (a) CHC and (b) PHB?

A PHB is based on the overall budget required to meet assessed care needs for a person who is eligible for CHC funding and is based on the individual's presenting needs and care requirements. Set amounts with ceiling costs are not in place as decisions are based on individual need and the resources of the CCG to meet needs safely and appropriately.

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Where an individual is eligible for CHC care is commissioned from an independent care provider which may be in a residential care placement or with a domiciliary care provider. If a PHB is in place for a CHC patient this allows for greater flexibility with care provision and dependant on individual choice for a family member to be appointed as a carer / personal assistant under exceptional circumstances where this is agreed with the CCG as in the patient's best interests as part of the support planning process.
